WAYNE COUNTY TEEN/PRETEEN/JUNIOR RULES

1. Each contestant must participate within their age group.
2. She must be an Indiana resident, a U.S. citizen and represent their home county. One of the contestant's parents or legal guardians must also be an Indiana resident. The only exception: the contestant may reside in an adjoining Indiana county in the majority of their activities are in the county in which they enter the contest.
3. No professional model is eligible (A professional model is one who earns a livelihood by modeling.) A contestant who has had training or schooling in the modeling field, has been paid on occasion for modeling or works for a fashion board is not considered a professional model.
4. Any contestant who has competed and won in their age division, can participate in that same age division, however are not eligible to win again (even as an alternate) in the same age division.
5. Teens/PreTeens/Juniors will participate in a private judging, on Saturday, June 13th. Time to be determined.
6. On Saturday evening, June 13th, the contest location is to be at Centerville High School.

8. **An entry fee must accompany the application form, (see form for entry fee).** Please send entry fee by check or money order payable to: Wayne County 4-H Queen Committee
9. It's highly suggested that each contestant attends the following:
 - Orientation – May 17th from 2-4pm at Better Homes & Garden Depot Grand Hall
 - Practice – June 3th from 6-8pm
 - Practice – June 4th from 6-8pm
 - Practice – June 10th from 6-8pm
 - Practice – June 11th from 6-8pm
 - Contest – June 13th from 9am – 2pm (tentative) and return from 6:30pm – 8:30pm (tentative)
 - Public Contest starts at 7pm, at Centerville High School
10. The judging on Saturday morning/afternoon, June 13th is private. The evening judging and crowning is open to the public.
11. No mother, relative or friend may be in the dressing room during any of the judging activities or the pageant.
12. Participant **MUST** currently be in 4-H.

Participant Information

Based on the total number of winning eligible participates, the following is the breakdown of alternates:

7 participates or less – Queen ONLY

8 participates or more – Queen and First Alternate

Judges and Awards

1. Two to Three judges will be named by the committee and their decision will be final.
2. One contestant will be selected to reign as the Teen, PreTeen and Junior Queen.
3. The public judging and crowning of the Queen will take place on Saturday, June 13th at 7:00 p.m., at Centerville High School. Admission is \$3.00 per person. Contestants will receive 2 free admissions.
4. Judging will be on the basis of overall impression, and personality.

The judging is divided into two divisions:

Division I – PARTY OR CHURCH WEAR

Attire: (Total 20 points)

Division II – INTERVIEW

Each contestant will have three (3) minutes or less before the judges. Contestants will answer impromptu questions asked by the judges. (Total 50 points)

Duties of Wayne County 4-H Teen, PreTeen and Junior Queen

The Wayne County 4-H Teen/PreTeen/Junior Queen will reign during the 2026 4-H Fair and until a new Teen/PreTeen/Junior queen is selected the following year. She will take part in the fair activities, i.e., presenting awards to exhibit winners, fashion revue winner, etc. A schedule will be given to the Teen, PreTeen and Junior Queen the evening of the contest or soon thereafter.
